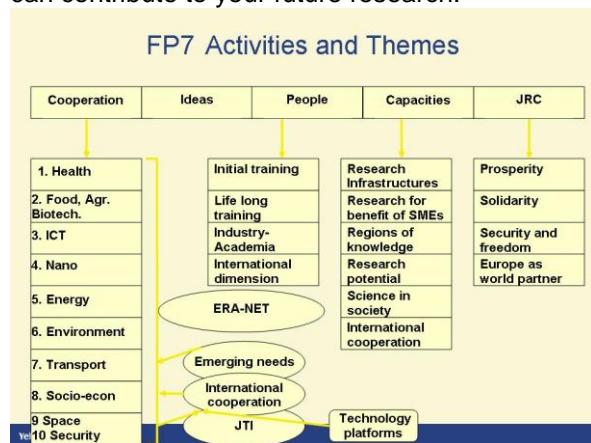

## Workshop Strategic use of FP7 for research

The workshop will take place in Hotel Atrium, Szczecin, Poland

### 1. Workshop

We cover the structure and content of FP7, the way Calls are developed, the role of Technology Platforms and other inputs to FP7, the evaluation and negotiation processes. This Workshop emphasizes the key elements that go into making strategic decisions on how FP7 funding can contribute to your future research.



From the above mentioned programme and themes we will focus on Day 1 on individual grants. How to obtain these grants and how valuable they can be in the further development of your career. We kick off with the broad scope of possibilities within the Marie Curie mobility schemes. The main topic of the afternoon will be the ERC starting grants of the Ideas themes. How to obtain as a young researcher such a prestigious grant.

In Day 2 we will look at aspects of intellectual property strategies and management structures within complex collaborations as well as the generic importance of these topics for other career paths then within academia.

### 2. Training objectives

To understand the possibilities for research funding offered by the seventh framework programme as well as other programmes. We will emphasize the importance of understanding the current definition of European scientific excellence.

### 3. Who should attend?

This workshop is geared towards younger researchers (early stage researchers as well as post docs) with hardly any experience in grant application.

### 4. Methodology

The seminar will be in English, with no translation. Periods of discussion are included in the programme to promote exchange of views between participants and trainer.
